Preventing Slips, Trips and Falls

| Hazard Identified | Control |

| Spillage of wet and/or dry substances | Clean spills up immediately. If a liquid is greasy, make sure a suitable cleaning agent is used. After cleaning the floor can be wet for some time, dry it where possible. Use appropriate barriers to alert people to the wet floor and arrange bypass routes. |
| Trailing cables/cords | Position equipment to avoid cables crossing pedestrian routes, use cable covers, restrict access to prevent contact. Consider the use of cordless tools. Remember, contractors will need to be monitored also. |
| Miscellaneous trash, paper or plastic bags | Keep areas clear, remove accumulated debris and establish a regular schedule to clean to prevent future build up. |
| Rugs and Mats | Ensure mats are securely fixed and do not have curling edges. Replace when worn. |
| Poor Lighting | Improve lighting levels and placement of lighting fixtures to ensure even lighting of all floor areas. |
| Slippery Surfaces | Assess the cause and treat accordingly |
| Change from wet to dry floor surfaces | Provide warning signs, provide mats and door mats as appropriate |
| Changes of level | Eliminate if possible. Improve lighting and add high visibility tread nosing. Provide warning signs. |
| Slopes | Provide hand rails, ensure good visibility and lighting, provide signs. |
| Smoke/steam obscures view | Eliminate or control by redirecting, improving ventilation and warning signage |
